FLORIDA

Fla. Stat. § 743.067:
Unaccompanied homeless youth 16 and older can consent for their or their children's medical, dental, psychological, substance abuse and surgical diagnosis and treatment. Unaccompanied homeless status can be documented by a school district homeless liaison, shelter, social worker, or court.

McKinney-Vento Act (MVA) requires school districts and schools to improve the awareness of the policy and the rights afforded to homeless families.*
